
Beginning English Lesson 5: Talking About Your Family

Learn how to ask and answer questions about family.

Who is in your family?



Sam and Mary are married – they are spouses. Sam is Mary's **spouse**, and Mary is Sam's **spouse**.

Sam is the **husband**, and Mary is the **wife**.

Mary and Sam have three children: Elizabeth, Nick, and Tom. Mary is the children's **mother**. Sam is the children's **father**. Elizabeth is the **daughter**, and Nick and Tom are the **sons**.



Elizabeth is the **sister** of Nick and Tom. Nick and Tom are Elizabeth's **brothers**. All three of them are **siblings**. Since Elizabeth is only 10 years old, she is the **younger sister** of Nick and Tom. Tom and Nick are her **older brothers**. Elizabeth is the baby of the family. She is the **youngest** of the three. Tom is 18 years old. He is the **oldest**. Nick is the middle child. He is **younger than** Tom, and **older than** Elizabeth.
